Reading the book

Very pleasant to read, the chapters are shorts and they are well synthesized. The illustrations allow the reader to have a good understanding of everything: places, equipments and people. After a necessary description of the journey to the crash site, we get a good feeling of the conditions of travel and a first evaluation of the landscape around.

When we just begin to smell the hot sand and the cacti, in Texas, military radars detect an UFO coming full speed from the Gulf of Mexico toward the US airspace.

It's a hot evening. But finished the vacation time and wake up, something happens! And after only six pages, the story starts.

The story

A captivating description of an extraordinary unbelievable event. Too fantastical to be Science Fiction. The authors describe very well the events and the reader participates at the recovery of the UFO by the Mexican Army and later by the US team.

Before the crash, there was an accident between the UFO and a civilian plane. The operations look like "live" at the TV or in the radio. We discover step by step all the problems resulting of the crash and the way they were cured until the "filing" of the UFO somewhere on an unknown US base. We discover also the availability of the recovery team, able to be constitute somewhere in a very short time from "wedontknowhere". It's interesting to read how the US recovery team negotiated with the foreign Country in order to be allowed to go into the Mexican territory.

The investigation

Once again, we feel how it's difficult to make such an investigation, more than 30 years after the event. We understand how difficult it is to meet testimony or at least "second source" testimonies and also how difficult it is to progress in the landscape and to discover another

world where an impossible accident took place. The chapter "zone of silence" describes very well the place, so much that you feel absolutely alone and ready to face any unconceivable problem when reading.

After the description of the 1974 events and the local country the reader is sure to be in a Hollywood movie.

Then we start to know what happened at the end of the 40's and in the 50's. Like the mistakes and the crashes on the Mexican territory regarding V2 missile launches, the crash of an unidentified V2, other UFO crashes, an other encounter between a civil airplane and a UFO nine months after the Coyame Chihuahua accident and crash.

Credibility of the event

It was made public by an unidentified "Deneb" team in a document that report with accuracy, facts, times, type of equipments and places. It looks like written by people having a good understanding of what they "talk about". There is neither embroidery nor paranormal temptation detectable in the text.

If that "Deneb" report is an official disinformation, then it can't be of any help neither for the ufologists nor for the skeptics or any administration. If it's a true information, the ufologists can't get new parameters regarding the unidentified object because it is now filed somewhere in an unknown base. What is important is the event, the date and the place of the accident, to add it to the list of the Northern Mexico UFO crashes, and the availability, the practice and the fast reaction of the US recovery team.

My mother language is French, but reading that book was pleasant and very attractive. I learnt so much in a so short time. Thank you Noe and Ruben.to have decided to write "Mexico's Roswell – The Chihuahua UFO Crash", it is a major tool for the ufologists.
